

- Training and capacity development are central to IDEP's mission, focusing on enhancing the skills of government officials and stakeholders across Africa
- These activities align with international, regional, and national development agendas, particularly the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the African Union's Agenda 2063
- IDEP has trained over 17,000 public officials and stakeholders, with a significant increase in participation since 2020 due to enhanced eLearning services

Key Components

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On-Site Courses



- **Short Courses:** Typically last one to two weeks, focusing on economic policymaking, management, and development planning. Courses are held in Dakar or other locations and are open to public sector officials, private sector participants, parliamentarians, and civil society
- **Tailor-Made Short Courses:** Designed in response to specific requests from African Member States or Regional Economic Communities (RECs), these courses address particular needs in economic governance and development planning



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Master's Programme

- Relaunch of the IDEP & University of Johannesburg MPhil in Industrial Policy, a flagship programme to equip students with advanced knowledge in industrial policy, fostering professional relationships across Africa

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Online & Blended Training

- Asynchronous Instructor-led Training (ILT): Courses are organized with narrative lessons, videos, and assessments, with instructor interaction through forums and webinars. Offline learning is possible
- Synchronous Instructor-led Learning: Live virtual training sessions to enhance engagement and interaction
- Self-Paced Learning: Web-based courses available in English and French
- Blended Learning: Combines online ILT with face-to-face training, culminating in advanced in-person sessions for selected trainees
- Hybrid Training: A mix of in-situ and remote learning, accommodating both online and on-site participants


Participation Statistics (2018–2023)

- Over 10,300 participants from across Africa, with a distribution of 55.6% from West Africa, 15.1% from East Africa, 8.9% from Central Africa, 7.7% from Southern Africa, 4.3% from North Africa, and 8.32% from other regions
